If we are going to spend eternity in heaven praising Jesus, this should show us that celebrating the Lord is time well spent.

One of the unique parts of my position is I have the joy of being part of all of our churches. Some are traditional, some are contemporary, some are highly structured, some are less structured, and some I only catch every 10th word in our non-English speaking churches. What a beautiful kaleidoscope of worshipping our one Lord and King in many ways. Whatever the case, celebrating King Jesus is always time well spent.

- It brings us closer to our church family.
 Worship should and must be something that unites us together. When you and I celebrate our risen King, it is time that blossoms and has wonderful ripple effects through all areas of our lives.
- 2) Make family time and our other relationships special and meaningful.

There are a couple of items on this list that I have to be very intentional about, this is one of them. You see, I am highly task-oriented, this isn't an excuse it is just part of my personality. Yet because I am so highly task-oriented, if I am not careful and intentional it can negatively affect my relationships. 


